His name was Lelon Franklin Fraiser Sr. Lelon grew up in Liberty County, GA and was educated at the old Liberty County High School. After leaving school, he traveled to Virginia for a job. Although he had a good job, he decided to come back home. He was hired at Interstate Paper on April 16, 1968. His work ethic

enabled him to become a crew leader, but after 35 years of dedication and hard work, he retired on October 3, 2003.

Many who know Mr. Lelon Fraiser knew he was a man of God. He loved and praised God. At any time, he could be heard singing his favorite hymn "What a Friend we have in Jesus" or reading his favorite scripture Psalm 23. He understood and believed that with God, he wouldn't lack anything he needed. As a young boy, he was raised in the church and grew up learning about the Bible. Since the age of six he has been a faithful member of Pleasant Grove AME Church in Hinesville, Ga where was a member of the Sons of Allen. He has spent many Sundays uplifting God by singing in the choir. His love and knowledge of carpentry allowed him to work for the church. He was able to use his talents as a church trustee. Whether it was hanging a door, painting a wall or measuring

the floor, he was always ready to support his church. There were many days when his blue truck was at Pleasant Grove and he was somewhere doing something and everyone would say, "We saw Lelon at the church". His dedication and hard work to his church on Oglethorpe Highway spans many years. One of his favorite activities was the annual Camp Meeting where he would eat and share with others his favorite food- hot, fried whiting fish.

Although much of his time was spent at Interstate or Pleasant Grove, he saved some time for his hobbies which were watching wrestling and basketball. His no nonsense wit and quick one liners having many laughing or shaking their heads. Mr. Fraiser is also known to have a green thumb. For many years, he worked in his garden where he grew watermelon, corn, peas, etc. and shared them with people in the community. His unselfish acts allowed Lelon to let his little light shine.
